WAY OF THE CROSS, Good Friday, March 29th - There will be an outdoor procession of the Way of the Cross on Good Friday, March 29 at 1:00 pm at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The procession will begin at the front of the Church and proceed around the Cathedral block (via Golding Street, Bayard Drive and Paddock Street) before ending back at the Cathedral. The liturgy for Good Friday will follow in the church at 3:00 pm. An indoor Way of the Cross will be held at 7:00 pm inside the Cathedral.
